

ADDRESS OF POPE JOHN PAUL II TO A GROUP OF VISITORS FROM SRI LANKA

Thursday, 28 April 1983

It gives me great pleasure today to welcome to the Vatican this interdenominational group of visitors from Sri Lanka.

You have expressed a desire for this encounter. It is my hope that your brief visit will leave you with many pleasant memories. The buildings you see, and their many works of art, especially Saint Peter's Basilica, honour the memory of the first of Christ's Apostles, Peter, the fisherman from Galilee. May this meeting serve to further the cause of harmony and collaboration between the different religious traditions present in your country.
